Our services for child victims of sexual abuse include:

- ♦ Forensic Interviews
- ♦ Medical Exams
- ♦ Advocacy
- ♦ Counseling
- ♦ Community Education

Our referrals come directly from Law Enforcement and Social Services.

#### **Care Cottage Mission:**

The mission of the Kentucky River Child Advocacy Center is to provide a comfortable, safe environment where children who have victims of sexual abuse and their non-offending caregivers may receive services from each agency involved in the investigation and prosecution of these cases. We strive to provide a location where investigations may be preformed in as timely manner as possible and to link children and families to services they may need both immediately and in the future.

The Care Cottage participated in many outreach programs this summer.

- ⇒ April 5th the Care Cottage set up an information and outreach booth in Leslie County in honor of Child Abuse Awareness month.
- ⇒ April 8th the Care Cottage joined the Rising Center and Mayor Donald "Happy" Mobelini in signing a proclamation proclaiming April as both Child Abuse Awareness Month and Sexual Assault Awareness Month.
- ⇒ April 17th Care Cottage staff and DCBS specialized investigation personnel worked with the Kindergarten class of Roy G Eversole to plant pinwheels in front of the school followed by an Easter egg hunt. The pinwheel is the national symbol for child abuse prevention. It has come to serve as the physical embodiment, or reminder, of the great childhoods we want for all children.
- ⇒ The Beaver STLP team has chosen the Care Cottage as their project to help prevent child abuse. They arrived at our Open House on April 16th to present a donation in the amount of \$1500, which included much needed supplies for the Care Cottage as well. April 12, The Care Cottage in collaboration with The Rising Center hosted the 1st Annual Trauma Conference at LKLP in Hazard, Ky. Speakers included Holly



Combs, LPA whose presentation focused on the cooccurrence of sexual violence and substance abuse. Seleslie Harris, Prevention Educator, presented the Green Dot Training that highlighted violence prevention strategies. Victoria Halcomb, Victims Advocate of the Care Cottage presented the Stewards of Children: Darkness

to Light Child Sexual Abuse Training. This workshop was made possible by funding provided by Perry County ASAP & Perry County UNITE. Door prizes donated by Karma Spa and Salon, Merle Norman, The Decorating Center, and The Mercantile on Main.






### SPARK "Light the way" Rally



The Care Cottage joined SPARK ministries in Hazard, KY in May to shine a light on mental heath, substance abuse issues, and recovery in our community as part of the SPARK "Light the Way" Rally in downtown Hazard. Care Cottage staff set up information on the correlation between childhood trauma, mental health, and future substance use as part of our outreach and awareness. Many people, who passed by our table, stopped to speak to staff making comments such as, "I wish a center like this would have been available when I was a child. My life may have turned out entirely different" and "This information is so interesting, I never thought about my addiction stemming from my childhood problems."





### **Defenders of Innocence**

Community partners paired with the Care Cottage at New Hope Church to provide information and awareness to the community about child sexual abuse, how to identify and correct situations, and what services are in our area to help those who have been abused. This event was concluded with the Stewards of Children: Darkness to Light training presented by authorized facilitator Victoria Halcomb.

#### What is Stewards of Children?

Stewards of Children® is a prevention training that teaches adults how to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. The program is designed for organizations that serve youth and for individuals concerned about the safety of children. It is the only nationally distributed, evidence-informed program proven to increase knowledge, improve attitudes, and change child protective behaviors.
